The Oregon Board of Dentistry regulates the practice of dentistry and dental hygiene in the state of Oregon.

The Board is required to investigate all complaints filed with the Board.

The Board may discipline a licensed dentist or dental hygienist who violates the law.

The Board does not have jurisdiction over: fees, personality conflicts, rude behavior, or the scheduling of appointments.

OPTION

Discuss the complaint with the dentist, dental hygienist, or his or her supervisor.

Dentists and dental hygienists are in most cases business people and are sensitive to complaints about their services. You may feel reluctant to approach the dentist or dental hygienist or his or her supervisor about your dissatisfaction, but many complaints are resolved in this manner and it might be your most convenient way to proceed.

OPTION

OPTION

The Oregon Dental Association (ODA) has a peer review process. That process is confidential and available provided the complaint falls within peer review guidelines and the dentist is an ODA member. OPTION

A consumer always has the option of retaining an attorney for the purposes of bringing a personal injury lawsuit or other legal action against a dentist or a dental hygienist.

OPTION

File a complaint with the Oregon Board of Dentistry. Violations of the Dental Practice Act and the rules of the Board could result in disciplinary actions up to, and including license revocation. However, the resolution of a complaint does not guarantee any damages will be awarded to the complainant.

HOW LONG DOES A BOARD COMPLAINT TAKE?

The investigation and resolution of a Board complaint is not a quick process and investigations of complaints involving multiple allegations and many witnesses would require even more time.

NATURE OF YOUR COMPLAINT (INCLUDE DATES OF TREATMENT AND NAMES OF OTHER DENTISTS WHO TREATED YOU):

I have attached a copy of a civil complaint I filed in Multnomah Co Civil Court (Case No 22CV44081) which details a conspiracy of regional dentists involved in placing and/or concealing one or more nonconsensual wirelessly accessible biomedical implants around tooth 14 and tooth 15. I believe one of these biomedical implants is visible in attached radiograph.

This area causes problems for me DAILY via what feels like radiation or wireless weapons, with, I believe, an intent to cause cancer. Aside from the surgeon who would have embedded the device in tooth 14 cavity, all oral surgeons in the area who take my insurance have refused to even examine me.

AFA the civil complaint, because of the conspiracy, I was unable to get a dentist to testify on my behalf, and for that reason, the case was dismissed due to lack of expert testimony. Because I have other evidence, including evidence of clear and consistent patterns of lying and omission in dental (and medical) charts, and lots of contemporary documentation of events - and because I was not permitted to conduct a full process of discovery or to attempt to compel expert testimony - the case is in appeal. Meanwhile I am suffering and in danger.

A dental expert should be able to examine original radiographs and see if

1. there appears to be a patch-shaped object embedded in the extraction cavity of tooth 14 per an x-ray taken at Advantage Dental Gateway Clinic (February 22, 2022)
2. the follow up x-ray taken at Roots Dental (Powell) by Dr Dickenson's assistant was over-exposed (April 8, 2022) thus concealing the area of concern

An expert in biomedical technology should be able to investigate this issue further via imaging and/or frequency detection.

Because these wirelessly accessible biomedical implants are part of a conspiracy to commit murder, I audio recorded dental visits beginning in 11/19. Recordings show significant discrepancies between what is in my dental charts and reports made to dentists.

There were unwarranted calls to mental health services by a Willamette Dental employee in November 2019 and false claims of abusive behavior made by Dr Jamus at Advantage Dental which can be compared against audio recordings of these visits. The point is not so much that they falsely claimed that I am delusional and abusive, but that these false claims are part of concealing the actual crime - the use of these biomedical implants to torture, maim, and murder.

I have copies of correspondence and dental records and I still have the original crown from tooth 14 in my possession.
