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Dear OBD,

On November 22, 2023 I filed a complaint with your office regarding deliberate implanting of biomedical devices into dental work, first a crown (tooth 14 – which has been extracted and which I should still have in my possession), and then, after the crown was extracted due to problems including heating and vibrating sensations causing radiating pain to surrounding tissues – into the tooth 14 extraction cavity. (There are other areas of concern as well.) With regards to the tooth 14 extraction cavity, I included a radiograph in which I can see a patch-shaped object. As I noted in the complaint, an attempt to take a second x-ray of this area thwarted by the x-ray being overexposed. The extraction of tooth 14 was done by Dr. Ashish Patel of Head & Neck Surgical Associates. Since that extraction was completed, every other oral surgeon in the region has refused to evaluate this issue.

I attached the original x-ray to the ODB complaint as well as an amended complaint in which I had attempted to self-litigate this issue, an attempt which failed due to dentists colluding to cover this up. This amended complaint contains a significant amount of detail, all of which I would testify to in court.

I have attempted to report this to police and FBI. They have simply ignored my reports. A scientific evaluation of the tooth 14 radiograph – and follow up tests as needed – is important to establish the veracity of my claim. I am unable to do this myself due to collusion by dentists.

I have not heard back from you regarding this complaint which was emailed to information@obd.oregon.gov on 11/22/2023 at 7:14 am (attached). Can you please confirm to me whether you received the original complaint and what the status of it is? Because these biomedical implants are wirelessly accessible, it's a continuing crime putting my health at risk.
